The Alternative Education Institute (AEI)

The Alternative Education Institute (AEI) program is a comprehensive educational program delivered in a non-traditional learning environment to help youth with parental consent between the ages of 16 – 17 and adults earn their **New Jersey State High School Equivalency Diploma**. Upon completion, the AEI program will continue to assist its students with entrance into post-secondary education, trade school and/or employment.

The Alternative Education Institute offers the following free educational services in English:

- AEI General Program (for participants 16 years and older)
- Every Tuesday Evening, **5:00 PM – 8:00 PM**

Eligibility Criteria:

- Must live in Middlesex County
- Must be enrolled in school or any other educational program
- Must be able to provide us valid documentation
- Must have access to an electronic device and internet

On Friday, June 13, 2025, the AEI program proudly graduated 27 students at the Raritan Bay Area YMCA in Perth Amboy, NJ. The ceremony also included general testers and Edison Job Corps participants. Guests were welcomed by Jaime Rivello, CEO of the Jewish Renaissance Foundation, with remarks from Tawayna Bailey (AEI Director), Jesse Shadle (Deputy Director, Edison Job Corps), Khadijah Roundtree-Bruton (AEI English Instructor), and Wendy Medina (AEI Bilingual Instructor and emcee).



Graduate speakers included Susana Andreu Garcia, Sandrita Green Jamarillo, Allie Rafael Alcantara, and Josue Antonio Maradiaga Reyes. The keynote address was delivered by Ms. Altigracia Raydeniss Ruiz, Dean of the Class of 2025 and P.O.W.E.R. Coordinator at North Brunswick Township High School, delivered a personal and inspiring message to the students encouraging them to use this moment as a stepping-stone to wherever life takes them next, and to allow the momentum of this occasion to propel them into higher heights.

Finally, the time that we all waited for had come, the graduates received their certificates of completion, and in one final conferment, switched their tassels from right to left. Students marched off stage to the reception area and shared some refreshments with their guests.

A Tribute to Our Members

In April 2025, we received heartbreaking news that our beloved AmeriCorps program would be discontinued due to a \$400 million federal budget cut by the Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE).

This unexpected decision forced us to say goodbye to our dedicated members, with their last day of service on May 9. However, in June, hope was restored. A federal judge ordered the reinstatement of AmeriCorps workers and funding—a victory for nonprofits and the communities we serve. We are cautiously optimistic and eager to welcome our members back. Through it all, our message to our AmeriCorps members remains the same.
