Chaperoning was our amazing Base team, Anyelina Alvarado, Program Director, Roseiry Jimenez, Mental Health Counselor, and Precious Ojeda, Program Coordinator. During the trip, students had the opportunity to visit Harvard University and Boston University. This trip allowed students to make new friends and also make connections with current students and staff from universities, in addition to asking many questions and learning about the campus life and programs of study on each campus. Having the opportunity to visit such prestigious schools for this student population is a great accomplishment and sparked much excitement. This trip helped encourage the students to feel more motivated to improve their academics. YOUTH ENTREPRENEURSHIP PROGRAM (YEP)

Our YEP students are learning about the importance of marketing to convince customers that a business is better than the competition. In this unit, students look at the importance of assembling a marketing plan and approaches to assembling customer profiles for their main customer segments.



With a focus on modern and cost-effective strategies, students put together their planned channels to customers and the key metrics they will use to measure the effectiveness of these channels. One of our favorite parts of the program is seeing the students play a game where they compete against a partner to see who can make the largest profit!

In addition, the YEP students are working on building and testing a pricing model for their product or service, in order to complete the Cost Structure and Revenue Streams tiles of the Lean Canvas.



Students use extended lab time to complete their work on the unit challenge: building and testing your revenue streams and cost structure with your customers to ensure you are selling your product or service competitively and profitably. In the Entrepreneurship Lab, students are given the freedom to work on whatever pieces of their Lean Canvas they need to work on.

EMERGING LEADERS (EL)

The fifth cohort of the Emerging Leaders' February meeting started with a team building activity and dove into reflecting on the February Homework. Emerging Leaders met guest speaker Kenny Ortiz, Superintendent of Recreation for the City of Perth Amboy.

Kenny has been a pillar of strength and support in our community and was able to talk about community engagement, program planning, and public health with our Emerging Leaders. The leaders asked questions and gave vital information regarding their stance on community service and other determinants health.

Raising Awareness About Poverty & **Food Insecurity in Middlesex County**

On May 25th, the IRF, in collaboration with REPLENISH and PRAB, hosted the Food for Thought Challenge; an interactive in-person experience that brings awareness through a visual representation to the issues of poverty in Middlesex County. Jose Montes, CEO of PRAB, Jennifer Apostol, Director of REPLENISH and Sherri Goldberg, Director of Community & Family Services of the JRF facilitated the conversation and Reginald Gaines, JRF Board Member, was Master of Ceremonies for the day.

Held at Middlesex College, in Edison, NJ, participants were divided into different income groups based on the most recent Middlesex County statistics, and were served a meal according to their assigned income level. Through this experience, participants were challenged with the true meaning behind the food insecurity and cost of living statistics presented in newspaper articles and reports, that many Middlesex County families know firsthand. Tying into REPLENISH's Spring School Food Drive, the top 45 schools that collected the most food were invited to join the conversation addressing food insecurity and poverty in their communities. Teachers, principals, and community leaders from all over the county came together to discuss some contributing factors of poverty, such as the high cost of living, unemployment, and of course, the Covid-19 Pandemic. Participants left the event with a greater understanding of the actual number of residents living in poverty and how they can help their students/constituents get involved during these challenging times.

In addition to our facilitators, NJ County Commissioner, Charles E. Tomaro welcomed the group, and Mayor Helmin Caba, of the City of Perth Amboy, and Dianne Roman, Director of Human Services of Perth Amboy, shared some inspiring words with participants. In addition, our County Clerk, Nancy Pintkin was able to stop by as well.

We thank all the schools who participated in REPLENISH's Spring School Food Drive and for fostering our youth's empathy and community service. We would also like to thank our amazing partners, REPLENISH, PRAB, and Middlesex College! We could not have done it without you!


